BOND WORK - BEGINNING - NOTE CHANGE IN ENTRANCE

Per state law, round two of the bond work that the voters approved a few years ago must begin. Please note the funds the bond work are coming from are not from the same funds the school is run from and must stay separate. One of the parts of phase two is the main entrance. This means door 3 (which we have been using as our main entrance for some time) will be closed. Door 1 will be our temporary main entrance until the summer time when door 3 will become our main entrance again for the 25-26 school year. Door 1 is the old entrance - the one closest to the elementary. This means all late arrivals, all early pick ups will enter/exit through that door. We apologize for the inconvenience and will have someone at that desk. This also means the auxiliary gym work is starting - so please do not park in the gravel area near the softball/baseball areas.

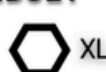
