MIDDLE SCHOOL DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP

Between online assignments, virtual therapy, social media, and smartphones, technology cannot be avoided. Unfortunately, what happens online often sets the stage for what happens in real life at our students' schools. As adults, we do what we can to monitor our youth but at some point, they are left to their own devices. This short workshop provides education and usable tools for today's students to have (and understand) proper digital citizenship. Popular social media apps and their uses are detailed, along with how to make safe choices. The presentation is presented by licensed mental health specialists and certified prevention specialists.

EXECUTIVE FUNCTION

I have been hearing from many parents (mostly middle school) that their students are struggling with organization, prioritization, and basic skills like turning their work in. I would like to share with you some information on executive function - see the next page's infographic. Students are not born with these skills. We have to model and teach them. In middle school, as students start to change classes more frequently and have more teachers, this struggle becomes more evident. It is important to work with your students and talk with them on how to help them stay organized and how to keep track of all they have going on. As a staff, we are also learning more about executive function this year as part of our professional development. We are learning so we can support students a little differently than in the past. However, we also need to partner with families since students need modeling and support from many places to find systems that work well for them.


