NWEA Fall Assessment Data

- This assessment for Reading and Math was administered to students in Kindergarten-10th grades within the first 9 weeks of school, and again in January
 - In compliance with the assurances in the Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan (ECOL)
 - Reporting is only required for up to 8th grade
 - Reporting at a public board meeting required as part of 98b/104h (formerly 98b/104a) reporting
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Grade Level RIT Scores (Winter 22-23)

- A RIT score is an estimation of a student's instructional level and also measures student progress or growth in school
- The RIT scale is an equal-interval scale much like feet and inches on a yardstick. It is used to chart your child's academic growth from year to year
- Enables teachers to pinpoint what students have learned and what students are ready to learn
- Important to remember that while there is data that may be the norm for grade levels, it is normative, not grade level proficiency, data

District Approved Goals

Goal 1 (Middle of the Year Reading Goal)- After the winter benchmark NWEA assessment, our average RIT scores per grade level in Reading will increase by two points from the fall assessment average. **Met by all grades**

Goal 2 (End of the Year Reading Goal)- After the spring benchmark NWEA assessment, our average RIT scores per grade level in Reading will increase by four points from the winter assessment average. **Met by all Grade Levels**

Goal 3 (Middle of the Year Math Goal)- After the winter benchmark NWEA assessment, our average RIT scores per grade level in Math will increase by two points from the fall assessment average. **Met by all grades except 4th and 7th**

Goal 4 (End of the Year Math Goal)- After the spring benchmark NWEA assessment, our average RIT scores per grade level in Math will increase by four points from the winter assessment average. **Met by all Grade Levels**
